North Texas came into the New Orleans Bowl with a losing record, and Colorado State made sure the Mean Green left that way.

Justin Gallimore blocked a punt and recovered it for a touchdown as Colorado State opened the bowl season with a 45-20 victory. Gallimore earned MVP honors.

North Texas was the first team with a losing record to play in a bowl game since 1970, when William & Mary went to the Tangerine Bowl at 5-6 and lost to Toledo 40-12.

The Mean Green earned the bowl bid by finishing first in the Sun Belt Conference, which posted a combined 5-32 non-conference record.

"The critical plays of the game that kind of swung the tide went to them and that's football," North Texas head coach Darrell Dickey said. "A lot of the mistakes we made tonight were things we didn't do to get here."

Colorado State's Bradlee Van Pelt throw for one touchdown and run for another score. The Superdome fans were well behaved, a day after the NFL game between the Rams and the Saints was briefly delayed at the stadium because of debris thrown from the stands.

Gallimore's touchdown gave Colorado State a 31-14 lead, and came just four plays after Van Pelt fumbled on the North Texas 16 -- one of his three turnovers.

"It seems like I'm always waiting for special teams to do something," Colorado State head coach Sonny Lubick said. "Their quarterback was getting hot. That blocked punt ... deflated them. From that point we took control."

After receiving the opening kickoff, Colorado State needed only three plays to score. Van Pelt hit Pete Rebstock with a 56-yard pass to set up Brad Svoboda's 2-yard TD run on a reverse.

Colorado State took a 17-0 lead when Van Pelt hit Jose Ochoa from 8 yards out, capping a drive that began when North Texas running back Kevin Galbreath fumbled on his own 11.

"North Texas might not have gotten much respect from the media and all, but we knew they would come out hard," Rebstock said. "We knew that had a chip on their shoulder. We wanted to take their thunder away early."

North Texas cut the lead to 17-7 on a 5-yard pass from Scott Hall to Dustin Dean.

Patrick Cobbs rushed for 46 yards during the 80-yard scoring drive.

The Rams' ensuing drive began near midfield after a 44-yard kickoff return by Dexter Wynn, and Van Pelt capped it with a 6-yard keeper to make it 24-7.

Van Pelt later threw two interceptions, and the second one led to Scott Hall's 42-yard touchdown pass to Ja'Mel Branch that closed North Texas to 24-14 just before halftime.

Five different Mean Green players came up with interceptions and running back Kevin Galbreath rushed for 130 yards and a touchdown to earn MVP honors as North Texas battled past Cincinnati, 24-19, to capture the second annual New Orleans Bowl.

North Texas got outstanding efforts in all phases of the game. The defense came up with a season-best five interceptions while the offense rode the legs of Galbreath for his eighth 100-yard rushing performance of the season. And on special teams, Ja'Mel Branch set up a touchdown with a 36-yard kickoff return, Patrick Cobbs had a 50-yard kickoff return and punter Brad Kadlubar nailed five of seven punts inside the 20-yard line.

Junior defensive back Jeremy Pearl highlighted the Mean Green's defensive play, returning his first career interception 27 yards for a touchdown in the second quarter that gave North Texas the lead for good. Also pulling down interceptions for the Mean Green were defensive backs Don McGee and Markeith Knowlton in the first quarter, linebacker Chris Hurd in the second and linebacker Cody Spencer in the third.

Galbreath took home the game's Most Valuable Player trophy after rushing 28 times for 130 yards and one touchdown. His score, coming on a 35-yard run on the first series of the second half, gave North Texas its biggest lead in the game at 24-7 with 12:58 left in the third quarter.

North Texas redshirt freshman quarterback Andrew Smith threw for 126 yards with one interception of his own. Five of his nine completions went to junior wide receiver Kevin Howard, giving him a career-high in catches for a game.

The Mean Green had to hold off a comeback effort by Cincinnati (7-7, 6-2) in the second half. Two Bearcat drives were held to field goals by Jonathan Ruffin before Cincinnati scored its final TD with 5:15 when Fran Callicott stripped the ball from Cobb and returned it 43 yards to pull the Bearcats to the final margin of 24-19.

Two big-play touchdowns in the second quarter overcame a sluggish start by North Texas and ignited the Mean Green to a 17-7 lead at halftime.

After falling behind 7-3 in the opening period, the Mean Green grabbed control of the game with the touchdown run by Cobbs and then Pearl's interception and return for a TD.

North Texas first got on the scoreboard with 0:58 left in the first quarter when Nick Bazaldua capped off a nine-play, 58-yard drive with a 30-yard field goal.

An interception by linebacker Chris Hurd stopped Cincinnati's first drive of the second quarter and set up North Texas' first score. Starting from their own 34, the Mean Green marched 66 yards in six plays with Cobbs busting loose for the final 27 yards to give NT its' first lead with 10:53 left in the period.

Later in the quarter, a 53-yard punt by Kadlubar was downed at the Bearcats' six-yard line, forcing Cincinnati to begin its series there. On a third-and-nine play from the seven, however, Pearl stepped in front of Gino Guidugli's pass in the left flat and returned it 20 yards for his first career interception and return for a TD.

Danny Wimprine threw for 254 yards and accounted for two touchdowns as Memphis won its first bowl game in 32 years, a 27-17 victory over North Texas.

Wimprine grew up in New Orleans and had played in the Superdome three times before, winning two Louisiana high school championships with John Curtis and a regular season game for Memphis over Tulane earlier during the 2003 season.

"It's been a long time coming for this university," said Wimprine. "All those seniors, those guys who have been here through so many tough times ... to go out as winners makes me feel great for this team," said Wimprine, a junior.

Memphis was without its best running back, DeAngelo Williams, who was the Conference USA player of the year. But Wimprine moved the offense early by completing his first 10 passes, including sideline bombs of 63 yards to Darren Garcia and 50 yards to Mario Pratcher. Both passes set up TDs as the Tigers took a 17-3 lead. Wimprine finished 17-of-23 with no interceptions.

Wimprine's touchdown pass was a 10-yard bullet to Chris Kelley as he crouched in tight coverage along the sideline. Wimprine also ran for a 7-yard score on a quarterback draw, the game's first touchdown.

North Texas' Patrick Cobbs, the nation's leader in rushing yards per game with 157, gained 110 yards and scored two touchdowns.

Scott Hall threw for 152 yards, completing several long passes in the second half on two touchdown drives as North Texas kept the game close well into the fourth quarter. North Texas has represented the fledgling Sun Belt Conference in all three New Orleans Bowls and won the game last year against Cincinnati.

The Mean Green made it 17-10 when Cobbs burst through a hole outside the left tackle and broke free for a 35-yard score.

After North Texas' defense had played a nearly flawless third quarter, a mistake by that unit allowed Memphis to regain a two-touchdown lead. North Texas appeared to have forced a punt just outside its own 40 when the Mean Green gang tackled LaKendus Cole on a screen play for a loss.

But Adrian Awasom was flagged for a 15-yard face-mask penalty that gave Memphis a first down on the North Texas 21. Several plays later, Cole squirmed his way into the end zone on a 5-yard run up the middle for a 24-10 lead.

Memphis needed the cushion as Hall completed two long passes in a 5-play, 86-yard drive made it 24-17 when Cobbs bowled his way into the end zone from 2 yards out.

Memphis then used up 4:47 on an 11-play drive that ended with Stephen Gostkowski's 42-yard field goal with 2:26 left.

After the victory, West thanked his players for having faith in his ability to turn around Memphis' long-struggling football program.

"These guys had to buy into a dream of what it could be, not what it was because it wasn't very good," Memphis head coach Tommy West said. "We had always been the type that had to learn how to handle adversity, now we've got to learn how to handle success, but I don't think that'll be a problem."

Southern Miss made its third consecutive bowl appearance a good one, defeating North Texas, 31-10, in the 2004 New Orleans Bowl.

"I think we played our best football of the season in the last three games," Southern Mississippi head coach Jeff Bower said. "It's a major win for our seniors. They've had a winning season all four years they've played at Southern Miss. No one wants to finish 6-6."

Southern Miss led the entire game, getting a 37-yard touchdown pass from Dustin Almond to Otho Graves to open the scoring, as it took a 7-0 lead with 11:01 to play in the first quarter. The Golden Eagles added a one-yard run by Almond with 6:13 to play in the first quarter, capping a five-play, 63-yard drive.

North Texas cut the lead to 14-3 on a 24-yard field goal from Nick Bazaldua, with 10:08 to play in the first half. Darren McCaleb connected on a 45-yard field goal from with 15 seconds remaining in the first half, as it led 17-3 at halftime.

The Golden Eagles had two opportunities to extend their lead in the third quarter, but McCaleb came up short on field goal tries of 33 and 42 yards. Still protecting a 17-3 lead, Michael Boley returned a 62-yard interception for a touchdown, giving Southern Miss a 24-3 lead.

Southern Miss added a one-yard touchdown run by Sherron Moore with 1:26 remaining, to take a 31-3 lead. North Texas got an 11-yard touchdown pass from Scott Hall to Johnny Quinn with one second remaining, to make the final score, 31-10.

Boley was named the 2004 New Orleans Bowl MVP, finishing the game with eight tackles, three tackles for loss and two sacks.

Almond finished with 247 passing yards, his second highest total of the season, as he completed 16-of-30 attempts. Almond now has nine over 200-yard passing performances in his career, which ranks fourth-best on in the school's history.

Anthony Harris finished the game with 14 carries for 104 yards, marking the second time this season his has ran for over 100 yards, both coming in the Louisiana Superdome, as he had 118 yards on 21 carries against Tulane (9/25). Harris now has seven 100-yard rushing games in his career, which ties him with Reggie Collier and Bubba Phillips for sixth in school history.

Antwon Courington finished the game with five catches for 57 yards. Courington has now caught a pass in 22-straight games. Courington finished the season with career highs in receptions with 47 and receiving yards with 659.

Graves led the team with 58 receiving yards on three catches, bringing his season total to six. Three of Graves' six catches this season went for touchdowns.

Trevis Coley recorded his fourth interception of the season, as he finished as the team's leader in interceptions.

Jamario Thomas finished with 92 rushing yards, Quinn finished with eight catches for 92 yards, while Hall finished with 134 passing yards for North Texas.

The University of Southern Mississippi's win in the New Orleans Bowl was a lot like the rest of the Golden Eagles' season - a struggle.

Shawn Nelson caught two second-half touchdowns and Cody Hull added 161 yards rushing to lead Southern Miss over Arkansas State 31-19.

Against Arkansas State, the Golden Eagles fumbled on their first two drives, but they finally took control in the second half.

Arkansas State tied the game at 17 in the third quarter on Nick Noce's 2-yard pass to Manuel Burton, but Dustin Almond answered with a 29-yard toss to Nelson to make it 24-17.

The Indians (ASU changed its nickname to Red Wolves in 2008) scored on a safety when Southern Miss punter Luke Johnson knocked the ball out of the back of the end zone after a bad snap. The Golden Eagles made it 31-19 on Almond's 6-yard pass to Nelson with 8:22 remaining in the game.

Southern Miss appeared on its way to an easy win when Almond found Nelson for a 37-yard completion on the first play from scrimmage. But after the Golden Eagles drove to the 1-yard line, Almond fumbled a snap and the Indians re-covered. Southern Miss' next drive ended with another fumble, this one at the Arkansas State 48.

The teams exchanged field goals in the second quarter, and Cole Mason put the Golden Eagles ahead 10-3 with a 5-yard run with 2:05 to play in the half. The Indians answered with an eight-play, 80-yard drive, capped by Noce's 4-yard run with 5.8 seconds remaining.

Southern Miss went ahead early in the third quarter. Kevis Coley recovered Noce's fumble at the Arkansas State 15 and returned it to the 10, setting up Hull's 1-yard scoring run.

The Indians came back again. On first-and-goal from the 2, Noce faked a quarterback draw and then backed up and threw to an open Burton in the back of the end zone. Antonio Warren rushed for only 20 yards for Arkansas State and left in the first half after reinjuring the ankle he sprained earlier in the year. He returned in the third quarter but wasn't much of a factor. His fumble at the Arkansas State 25 set up Southern Miss' final touchdown.

Noce went 10-of-19 for 213 yards with an interception. He also ran for 55 yards.

Almond, meanwhile, went 17-of-32 for 253 yards in his final college game.

Arkansas State's Darren Toney had a scintillating kickoff return nullified by a holding penalty in the second quarter. Toney ran about 25 yards upfield, retreated several steps and then streaked down the sideline for what would have been a 93-yard touchdown.

Arkansas State was the first Sun Belt Conference team besides North Texas to represent the league in the New Orleans Bowl. North Texas went the last four years, winning once.

Omar Haugabook was Troy's postseason star, too. The Sun Belt player of the year threw four touchdown passes and ran for another score to lead Troy to its first bowl victory, 41-17 over Rice in the R+L Carriers New Orleans Bowl.

It was only the second bowl appearance for the Trojans (8-5), who moved up to Division I-A in 2002. Troy earned the bowl bid with its first Sun Belt title.

Haugabook, the unanimous MVP of the game, completed 14 of 28 for 217 yards. He also picked up 92 of Troy's 148 yards.

"It was a real good game for me," Haugabook said. "At any given time we can put up points real fast."

Rice (7-6), coming off its first winning season since 1993, and making its first bowl appearance since 1961, was seeking its first postseason victory since 1954. The Conference USA representative was favored going into the game but could not cope with the Trojans' defense.

Rice's Joel Armstrong, pressured all night, was intercepted five times and sacked four times. He completed 35 of 54 passes for 305 yards and a touchdown.

Rice receiver Jarett Dillard kept his touchdown streak alive. He caught a 1-yard TD pass in the fourth quarter to stretch the streak to 15 games, dating to last season. His 13-game touchdown streak this season set an NCAA record, breaking the mark of 12 set by Randy Moss in 1997 and matched by Larry Fitzgerald in 2003.

Troy, which averaged 21 points a game this year, was up 21-7 after the first quarter. On the first possession, Mykeal Terry's 40-yard reception put the Trojans on Rice's 1.

Three plays later, Haugabook's 2-yard touchdown run put Troy on the scoreboard.

Minutes later, Armstrong's first pass attempt of the game was intercepted by Boris Lee, who took it back 22 yards to the Rice 1. Haugabook put the Trojans up 14-0 with a 3-yard scoring pass to Gary Banks.

Armstrong's 11-yard TD pass to Mike Falco cut Troy's lead to 14-7. Haugabook stretched the Trojans' first-quarter margin with a 56-yard touchdown pass to Terry.

After Rice's 43-yard field goal in the second quarter, Haugabook hit Andrew Davis with a 7-yard touchdown pass to put Troy up 28-10 at halftime.

"They basically at the beginning played a lot of man and wanted to be aggressive with us," Haugabook said. "But once we burned them a couple of times deep they started backing off."

The only score in the third quarter was a 25-yard field goal that boosted Troy's lead to 31-10. Kicker Greg Whibbs made it 34-10 in the fourth quarter with a 28-yarder.

Haugabook closed out the scoring with a 5-yard TD pass to Toris Rutledge.

Rusty Smith threw for 336 yards and an R+L Carriers New Orleans Bowl record five touchdowns to lead Florida Atlantic to a 44-27 victory over Memphis.

It was the first bowl game for FAU, which has had a football team for only seven seasons at its Boca Raton, Fla., campus and didn't join the NCAA's Football Bowl Subdivision (formerly Division I-A) until 2005.

"People are now going to recognize and know who we are," said Dilvory Edgecomb, who scored two touchdowns and set up two other scores with kickoff returns of 42 and 62 yards.

The game also marked another meaningful step for the young Sun Belt Conference. The league champion has now won three of seven New Orleans Bowls, including the past two by convincing margins, with Troy beating Rice 41-17 last year.

It certainly wasn't the highest-profile bowl victory for Schnellenberger, who led Miami to the 1983 national championship with an Orange Bowl triumph over Nebraska. He is now 5-0 in bowl games over his 23 seasons as a head coach. He won the 1980 Peach Bowl with Miami and two bowl games with Louisville, the 1990 Fiesta Bowl and the 1993 Liberty Bowl.

Florida Atlantic started fast and never trailed. Smith had 102 yards passing and a pair of touchdown tosses in the first 10 minutes. His second, a short pass that Edgecomb turned into a 29-yard score, gave FAU a 17-7 lead.

Memphis quarterback Martin Hankins helped the Tigers keep the game competitive into the second half, throwing for 283 yards and three touchdowns. The Tigers got as close as 30-27 after his 6-yard touchdown to Carlos Singleton.

But Memphis' next possession ended with a punt that Wilfred Rivera blocked to give the Owls the ball on the Tigers 19. Smith cashed in two plays later, finding Jason Harmon in the end zone for a 16-yard score and a 37-27 FAU lead.

Hankins then left the game late in the third quarter with a right leg injury after getting tangled up in a heap of players after releasing a pass. Reserve quarterbacks Will Hudgens and Matt Malouf finished the game for Memphis, which couldn't muster a significant threat in the final quarter.

Smith, the game's most valuable player, also had touchdown passes of 4 yards to Charles Pierre, 16 yards to Chris Bonner and 4 yards to Willie Rose.

Southern Miss overcame a 10-point fourth-quarter deficit with the help of a fourth-down touchdown pass, and Michael McGee blocked a field goal in overtime for a 30-27 victory over Troy in the R+L Carriers New Orleans Bowl.

The victory was the fifth straight for Southern Miss (7-6), which needed the first four to qualify for a bowl and the last one to extend the school's streak of consecutive winning seasons to 15.

Troy held Southern Miss to Britt Barefoot's 39-yard field goal on the first possession of OT, but that wound up being enough for the Golden Eagles to win their third New Orleans Bowl in three appearances.

McGee knifed in from the left end, diving as he smothered Sam Glusman's 28-yard kick to clinch the win.

The Trojans (8-5), winners of the Sun Belt Conference, led 27-17 after Jerrel Jernigan's 6-yard touchdown run late in the third quarter.

Southern Miss began its comeback when Austin Davis rolled out on fourth-and-2 and lofted a 35-yard touchdown to tight end Jonathan Massey with 7:20 left in regulation. Barefoot tied it with his 46-yard field goal with 2:50 to go.

When the game began, the Golden Eagles were penalized the loss of a timeout because they wore all-gold uniforms, defying orders that they wear white jerseys as the designated visiting team. They committed a false start while lining up for their first offensive play. Two plays later, Troy took a 7-0 lead on a defensive touchdown as Jorrick Calvin batted down Davis' lateral, then scooped it up for 17-yard fumble return.

Later in the first quarter, Southern Miss lost leading receiver DeAndre Brown, who broke his left leg on an awkward landing in the end zone after his attempt at a leaping catch was batted down in the first quarter.

Without his top target, Davis completed 20 of 34 passes for 276 yards and two touch-downs, including a 64-yard scoring pass to New Orleans native Gerald Baptiste on a flea flicker in the first quarter.

Southern Miss career rushing leader Damion Fletcher carried 14 times for 78 yards and a touchdown on an 8-yard end run. Fletcher also caught three passes for 23 yards, while Baptiste finished with five catches for 88 yards.

Troy's Levi Brown was 26-of-43 for 255 yards, including a 4-yard touchdown pass to Kennard Burton and Troy never trailed until overtime. After this game, Troy had to be happy to get out of Louisiana, where one of its most crushing losses came in mid-November.

Middle Tennessee quarterback Dwight Dasher got the best of Southern Miss -- and topped Vince Young, too.

Dasher ran for 201 yards -- the most by a quarterback in a bowl game -- and two touchdowns and threw two scoring passes to lead Middle Tennessee to a 42-32 victory over Southern Miss in the R&L Carriers New Orleans Bowl.

Dasher completed 15 of 25 passes for 162 yards and ran 26 times. He finished the season with 1,175 yards rushing. He broke the quarterback bowl rushing record of 200 yards set by Texas' Young in the 2006 Rose Bowl against Southern California.

Middle Tennessee (10-3), playing in the second bowl game in school history, concluded its best season since joining the Football Bowl Subdivision in 1999 with a seven-game winning streak and its first bowl victory.

"I've never been part of a team that plays harder than we do," Middle Tennessee coach Rick Stockstill said. "Other teams can't match our intensity, enthusiasm and toughness and that was evident today. We fell behind 14-0 but we never quit."

Southern Miss quarterback Martevious Young completed 18 of 34 passes for 271 yards and three touchdowns. He also threw two interceptions. Running back Damion Fletcher ran for 78 yards for the Golden Eagles.

Southern Miss started strong, scoring on their first possession as Tory Harrison rushed for a 2-yard touchdown. On their second possession, the Golden Eagles stretched the lead to 14-0 on a 24-yard reception by DeAndre Brown.

The Blue Raiders pulled even in the second quarter on an 11-yard reception by Garrett Anders, and -- after Alex Suber intercepted Young's pass on the Southern Miss 12 -- a 9-yard TD catch by Shane Blissard. Southern Miss held a 17-14 edge at halftime thanks to Daniel Hrapmann's 20-yard field goal as time expired.

Dasher opened the third quarter with a 35-yard touchdown run. When Dasher left briefly with an ankle injury, Brent Burnette capped 76-yard scoring drive with a 23-yard TD pass to Chris McClover.

Hrapmann hit a 38-yard field goal to cut the Blue Raiders lead to eight at 28-20 at the end of three quarters.

Southern Miss had a chance to tie it early in the fourth making it 28-26 on DeAndre's 7-yard TD reception, but the 2-point conversion failed.

Benjamin Cunningham and Dasher ran for touchdowns to put it out of reach for Middle Tennessee. USM added a final score with 27 seconds left to draw within 10.

Corey Robinson punctuated a formidable freshman season by helping Troy rewrite the R+L Carriers New Orleans Bowl record books. Robinson threw for 387 yards and four touchdowns, and Troy set a New Orleans Bowl scoring record with a 48-21 victory over Ohio.

Robinson completed 23 of 29 passes for 285 yards and four TDs in the first half alone, when Troy (8-5) raced to a 38-7 lead, and was 32 of 42 overall. Tebrius Gill had a New Orleans Bowl-record three touchdowns, all on receptions in the first half. Fellow senior Jerrel Jernigan had seven catches for 48 yards, including a 16-yard touchdown.

Troy finished with 602 offensive yards -- also a New Orleans Bowl record.

The Trojans had a 371-39 advantage in offensive yards through the first two quarters, by which time it was apparent Ohio (8-5) was going to drop to 0-5 in its bowl history.

So dominant were the Trojans that they didn't punt until the fourth quarter and even outrushed Ohio, which runs a variation of the option Solich used when he was at Nebraska from 1998-2003. Troy finished with 220 yards on the ground while the Bobcats had 99.

Troy's Dujuan Harris ran for 105 yards and a score. Robinson connected four times with Gill for 80 yards and four times with Jason Bruce for 59 yards.

The Bobcats' Boo Jackson passed for 209 yards and three TDs, but he did not start after missing some recent practices to clear up some academic matters.

Solich started Phil Bates, whose first pass was intercepted deep down the sideline by Jimmie Anderson. Troy then marched 78 yards in 10 plays, with Jernigan scoring on a 12-yard run out of the wildcat formation to make it 7-0.

Jackson entered the game during Ohio's second offensive season and completed a 34-yard touchdown pass to Steven Goulet to tie it at 7.

Troy went in front for good when Robinson lofted a 31-yard timing pass down the left sideline to Gill.

Jernigan capped Troy's next series with a 16-yard TD catch on which the receiver took a short pass near the 10 and dodged three tacklers.

Michael Taylor's New Orleans Bowl-record 50-yard field goal nudged Troy's lead up to 24-7.

Gill's 17-yard TD catch made it 31-7, marking the first time a team had scored that many points in a half of any of the 10 New Orleans Bowls.

Troy wasn't done, though. The third Robinson-to-Gill TD connection, covering 26 yards, came in the final minute of the second quarter.

Blaine Gautier threw for a record 470 yards and Brett Baer drilled a 50-yard field goal as time expired as the University of Louisiana at Lafayette rallied from behind to defeat San Diego State University, 32-30, in the 2011 R+L Carriers New Orleans Bowl. Gautier was named the game's Most Valuable Player after completing 24-of-40 passes for three touchdowns and an interception.

The Cajuns led 29-24 following a 22-yard Baer field goal with 2:09 left to play, but the Aztecs drove 69 yards in 10 plays capped by a 12-yard Colin Lockett-to-Ryan Lindley touchdown strike with 35 seconds remaining to give San Diego State a 30-29 lead.

UL, however, was not done as Gautier drove the Cajuns to the Aztec 43. With four seconds remaining, Baer lined up for the potential game winner, and got a five-yard boost when San Diego State was penalized for falsely simulating the snap of the ball. Baer and the Ragin' Cajuns lined up again from the 33 and the ball sailed through the uprights to spark the Cajuns celebration.

Javone Lawson was the top receiver for the Cajuns, catching nine passes for 193 yards and two scores while Ladarius Green hauled in five passes for 121 and a score. Alonzo Harris paced the Cajuns with 62 rushing yards on 14 carries.

San Diego State drew first blood, taking the opening kickoff and driving 53 yards on 11 plays before Abelardo Perez hit a 27-yard field goal to put the Aztecs on top, 3-0. The Cajuns took the lead two drives later on an 18-yard pass from Gautier to Lawson. Baer's PAT was blocked, but the Cajuns got the points back plus some as Darryl Surgent returned a punt 87 yards for a score to put the designated home team on top 13-3 one minute into the second quarter.

It remained a 10-point game into the second half, and the Cajuns wasted little time padding their lead in the third quarter as Gautier hit Green for a 20-yard scoring strike 59 seconds into the stanza to give the Cajuns a 19-3 advantage.

The Aztecs refused to go away and made things interesting with consecutive touchdown drives as Ryan Lindley connected with Colin Lockett for a pair of 16-yard touchdown passes with 12:54 and 3:40 left to play in the third quarter.

The Cajuns appeared to reclaim control of the contest with a 14-play, 78-yard drive which Gautier capped with an 11-yard touchdown pass to Lawson, but San Diego State kept the pressure on with a 5-yard touchdown jaunt with 5:40 left to play in the game to set up the late-game dramatics.

Terrance Broadway passed for 316 yards and ran for 108, helping the University of Louisiana at Lafayette repeat as winners of the R+L Carriers New Orleans Bowl with a 43-34 victory against East Carolina University.

Alonzo Harris rushed for 120 yards and two touchdowns for the Ragin' Cajuns, who briefly squandered a three-touchdown lead before moving back in front for good on Broadway's 14-yard scoring pass to Javone Lawson late in the third quarter. Broadway also ran for a 12-yard score and Brett Baer added his second and third field goals in the fourth quarter to seal the win.

Shane Carden passed for 278 yards and two touchdowns for ECU but was intercepted by Jemarious Moten in the fourth quarter to thwart a potential game-tying score.

Carden's touchdowns went to Justin Hardy for 19 yards and Danny Webster for 16 yards. East Carolina's Andrew Bodenheimer had five catches for a team-high 65 yards, but could not secure a crucial fourth-down pass in the final minutes as defensive back T.J. Worthy ripped the ball away in ECU territory and set up a Baer 40-yard field goal to account for the final score.

Louisiana jumped out to a 14-0 lead early in the second half on touchdown runs by Broadway and Harry Peoples, and led 28-7 with 7:05 to go before halftime.

The Pirates got a field goal by Warren Harvey and a 19-yard scoring strike from Carden to Danny Webster to make it 28-21, but Baer drilled a 50-yard field goal as the first half ended to give the Cajuns a 10-point lead.

East Carolina tied the score with a 45-yard Harvey kick and a 13-yard Reggie Bullock touchdown run, only to see Louisiana come right back with a seven-play, 76-yard drive which Lawson capped with a 14-yard juggling catch.

The ensuing point-after kick was blocked, however, and East Carolina pulled to 37-34 on Harvey's 26-yard field goal.

Broadway's lone interception on a tipped pass then gave East Carolina the ball on the Cajuns 39, but Moten was able to step in front of Carden's long pass over the middle to help preserve the slim lead.

The University of Louisiana at Lafayette ran out to a 21-0 lead and added a late field goal by Hunter Stover as the Ragin' Cajuns hung on to defeat Tulane in the R+L Carriers New Orleans Bowl for the third consecutive season and become just the ninth team in NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision history to win the same bowl three straight years.

Green Wave running back Orleans Darkwa was named game MVP after running for 83 yards and a New Orleans Bowl-record three touchdowns on 16 carries (5.2 avg.) to become the first player from a non-winning team to claim the honor.

Down by three touchdowns with 12:31 to play before halftime, the Green Wave roared back with two second-quarter touchdowns and tied things up at 21-all when Darkwa rambled in for 22 yards. Both teams traded punts, and Louisiana pinned Tulane at its own three-yard line. From there, cornerback Sean Thomas intercepted a hurried throw by Green Wave back-up quarterback Devin Powell with 11:04 left to play to set up Stover's game-winning kick.

Tulane had a chance to tie the game and potentially send the contest into overtime as Powell drove the Green Wave from its 16 to the Louisiana 30, but Cairo Santos' 48-yard field goal attempt sailed just wide of the left upright to spark the Ragin' Cajun celebration.

Turnovers played a big role in the ballgame as the two teams combined to snare five interceptions and turn them a total of 31 points, including an 83-yard pick-six by Cajuns cornerback Corey Trim early in the second quarter to stake Louisiana to a 21-0 lead.

Louisiana came out on fire, marching 65 yards on six plays which Elijah McGuire capped with a 27-yard touchdown run on its opening possession and added a 73-yard drive on half dozen plays with Alonzo Harris finding paydirt from 15 yards out on its third possession to stake the Ragin' Cajuns to a 14-0 lead.

Trim's pick-six extended the Louisiana lead to 21, but the Green Wave came alive on both sides of the ball.

After twice going three-and-out and seeing a pair of promising drives end with interceptions, the Tulane offense got on track midway through the second quarter as the Green Wave marched 71 yards on nine plays and Darkwa plunged into the endzone from one yard out to cut the Louisiana lead to 21-7 with 3:55 to go before halftime.

Green Wave cornerback Jordan Sullen gave his team the ball back three plays later with an interception of Cajuns' quarterback Terrance Broadway. Powell connected with wide receiver Ryan Grant for a 49-yard gain on the very next snap, Tulane got an additional 15 yards on a pass interference penalty and Darkwa ran in from the seven-yard line to make it a 21-14 contest at the break.

Neither team could get much going offensively early in the third quarter, but Tulane turned defense into offense with 2:40 to play in the period as Derrick Strozier picked off Broadway and returned the ball to the Ragin' Cajun 17-yard line. One play and a Green Wave penalty later, Darkwa ran in from 22 yards out to cap Tulane's scoring and set up the dramatic finish.

The adage, "Defense Wins Championships" was on display in the 14th annual R+L Carriers New Orleans Bowl on Saturday at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome as the Louisiana Ragin' Cajuns held Nevada in check all game, dominating defensively in a 16-3 win.

The three points allowed set a New Orleans Bowl-record. Nevada's (7-6) high-flying offense had not been held to just three points since a 35-0 loss at Notre Dame on Sept. 5, 2009.

With the victory, Louisiana (9-4) became the first school in college football bowl history to win the same bowl game in four straight seasons.

The Cajuns took the game's opening possession 77 yards in eight plays. Terrance Broadway connected on a 17-yard touchdown pass to C.J. Bates on third-and-nine. Little did anyone know at the time, that's all the offense the Cajuns would need.

Broadway was 3-for-3 on the drive and went on to complete 14 consecutive passes to start the game. No player in collegiate football bowl history had ever completed 14 straight passes to begin a bowl game. Overall, Broadway's feat ranks third behind Georgia's Mike Bobo (19 vs. Wisconsin, 1998 Outback) and NC State's Phillip Rivers (16 vs. Kansas, 2003 Tangerine).

Hunter Stover put the Cajuns up 10-0 late in the first quarter with a 46-yard field. Stover tacked on a 30-yard and 35-yard field goal in the fourth quarter. His three field goals tie a New Orleans Bowl record.

Wolfpack quarterback Cody Fajardo, who entered the game averaging 281 yards of total offense per game, was held to 173 total yards. The Cajuns offense outgained Nevada 411-213.

Nevada's best opportunity came on their third drive of the game. After a 59-yard punt by Daniel Cadona, the Wolfpack moved 69 yards in 11 plays, but the Cajuns defense made one of the game's key defensive plays. After a completion down to the Cajuns 11-yard line, Sean Thomas forced a fumble that was recovered by Dominique Tovell. The fumble recovery was the first of Tovell's career.

The only blemish on the Cajuns defense was a 21-yard field goal by Brent Zuzo. After a short punt, Nevada took over at the Louisiana 26-yard line. The Cajuns kept the Wolfpack out of the end zone, surrendering only 23 yards.

Louisiana limited Nevada to 81 yards in the second half and put an exclamation point on the win with back-to-back sacks on the final two plays. Darzil Washington registered two of the squad's four sacks.

Broadway finished 26-of-31 passing for 227 yards and was named MVP, becoming the first two-time MVP in New Orleans Bowl history.

Kenneth Dixon capped an extraordinary career at Louisiana Tech by setting NCAA touchdown and scoring records, all while leading the Bulldogs to a bowl victory.

Dixon had 215 yards from scrimmage and scored four times to become the NCAA's career leader with 87 touchdowns and 522 points, and Louisiana Tech snapped Arkansas State's eight-game winning streak with a 47-28 triumph in the New Orleans Bowl on Saturday night.

Quarterback Jeff Driskel had a stellar performance as well, as the transfer from Florida, closed out his college career by passing for 458 yards and three touchdowns for Louisiana Tech (9-4), which had 687 total yards in finishing a second straight season with a bowl victory.

Dixon caught six passes for 113 yards and touchdowns of 9 and 59 yards. He carried 21 times for 102 yards, including scoring runs of 8 and 4 yards. He entered the game as the nation's active leader in yards rushing and finished his career with 4,480 yards on the ground.

Dixon's No. 28 jersey was ripped on his first TD run. He was allowed to replace it, symbolically, with a No. 1 jersey for the remainder of the game.

Quarterback Fredi Knighten accounted for 179 yards from scrimmage and scored one TD rushing for the Red Wolves (9-4), who won the Sun Belt Conference.

Blaise Taylor had a 98-yard kickoff return TD for Arkansas State in the fourth quarter, but by then it was too late to mount a comeback.

Arkansas State's success this season stemmed from turnovers. The Red Wolves entered the game with 26 interceptions, most in the nation. But Tech did not turn the ball over, while Arkansas State turned it over three times on two interceptions and a fumble.

Arkansas State came in averaging 41 points per game, but did not manage an offensive touchdown after halftime.

Driskel got the Bulldogs off to a fast start, completing 10 of his first 12 passes for 170 yards and two touchdowns. He lofted long, accurate passes to set up each of the first two TDs -- a 53-yard connection with Carlos Henderson set up the first and a 45-yarder to Trent Taylor led to the second, which put Tech up 17-3.

Arkansas State rallied to tie the score by halftime. Warren Wand's 1-yard score capped a 14-play, 91-yard drive that cut it to 17-10. Late in the second quarter, Blaise Taylor's 41-yard punt return gave the Red Wolves the ball on the Tech 25. Four plays later, Knighten ran it in from the 1.

Tech took the lead for good on Dixon's second TD reception.

Arkansas State linebacker Xavier Woodson-Luster said his unit had a good plan for Dixon, but was done in by fundamentals.

Receiver Allenzae Stagers set records for receptions and receiving yards Saturday night as Southern Miss outlasted Louisiana 28-21 in the 16th annual R+L Carriers New Orleans Bowl at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome.

Stagers, who was named Southern Miss' Most Valuable Player, caught a career-high 11 passes for 230 yards and a touchdown before the fourth-largest crowd (35,601) in the bowl's history.

Running back Ito Smith rushed for 138 yards and two touchdowns Saturday against the Ragin' Cajuns, and caught a pass for a third, as the Golden Eagles won in the postseason for the first time since 2011.

Smith gained 105 yards and scored on a 1-yard run on 19 carries over the final two quarters as the Golden Eagles scored on a pair of lengthy, drives that ground off a third of the second half clock.

Louisiana, which had won three of its final four games to become bowl eligible, lost for the ninth consecutive time to the Golden Eagles, a former long-time rival, though the two had not met since 2008.

The Cajuns struggled to find any offensive consistency against the Golden Eagles. Two of UL's three touchdowns came on drives of 29 yards and 19 yards after USM turnovers.

All told, Louisiana managed just 252 total yards, including 95 yards passing.

The Cajuns came up short at the beginning of the game as well, as senior quarterback Nick Mullens and Stagers hooked up on long passes to set up Southern Miss' first two scores.

The two combined on a 55-yard pass down to the Ragin' Cajuns' 12-yard line on the Golden Eagles' first offensive snap. The strike set up Smith's bronco ride of an 11-yard run for a 7-0 Southern Miss lead with 9:39 left in the first quarter.

The game was tied at 14 with a Dion Ray run for the Cajuns, but Southern Miss took the lead once and for all in the third quarter on Stagers' lone touchdown reception of the contest. Smith tacked on another rushing touchdown in the fourth quarter.

The Cajuns made a late push after Cajuns quarterback Anthony Jennings rushed for his second touchdown of the game, but with just 2:15 left on the clock, it was too little, too late.

Louisiana's Elijah McGuire paced the ground attack for the Cajuns with 99 yards on 17 carries. Al Riles led the receiving corps with 64 yards on five receptions.

The game marked the Cajuns' fifth appearance in the last six years in the R+L Carriers New Orleans Bowl. It was also Southern Miss' fifth appearance in the game, and the Golden Eagles moved to 4-1 in those contests.

Brandon Silvers accounted for five touchdowns and Troy's defense recorded six sacks as the Trojans systematically dismantled North Texas, 50-30, in the R&L Carriers New Orleans Bowl.

Troy set the New Orleans Bowl record and the school's bowl record for points in a game against their former conference foe. The meeting was the first between the two since North Texas left the Sun Belt for Conference USA.

Silvers was named the New Orleans Bowl MVP after completing 24-of-31 passes for 305 yards and four touchdowns, while rushing for another score. Silvers became the school's all-time leader in career touchdowns responsible for with 87 as he past Corey Robinson's 84.

Silvers completed his first 10 pass attempts of the game and Josh Anderson scored twice on the ground in the game's first five minutes and 39 seconds. Anderson finished with a career-best 113 yards on 22 carries in the game.

His second score followed one of three fumbles recovered by the Trojan defense. Jamal Stodom dropped Mason Fine for a loss 10 yards behind the line of scrimmage and Sam Lebbie fell on the loose ball.

Troy held North Texas to -8 yards rushing in the game thanks to the six sacks and 11 tackles for loss.

North Texas scored two late touchdowns in the second quarter to turn a 15-point deficit into just a 22-20 halftime score. Following a 7-yard touchdown pass from Silvers to Damion Willis, the Mean Green returned a fumble 56-yards for a touchdown and got a late Fine touchdown pass.

That was the last good thing to happen for the Mean Green as Troy came out of the break determined to show its former conference mate what they left behind when they left the league.

Silvers opened the second half scoring with a 2-yard touchdown run and found Tevaris McCormick from 59-yards out with just over three minutes later to give Troy a 36-20 lead.

The large Troy contingent in the Superdome had more to cheer about on a 20-yard touchdown pass from Silvers to John Johnson with 2:02 to play in the quarter. Willis and Silvers connected again with just over four minutes left to seal the game for Troy.

Willis tied a New Orleans Bowl record with 11 catches while his 135 receiving yards were the second most in a bowl game in school history. McCormick added five catches for 107 yards making the pair the first since 2013 to top over 100 yards receiving in the same game.

Fine, the Conference USA Offensive Player of the Year, finished 30-of-54 for 303 yards with three touchdowns and two interceptions.

Stodom finished with a pair of tackles for loss, while Cedarius Rookard had a game-high nine tackles and two pass break ups. Lebbie added two stops behind the line with a sack in addition to forcing a fumble.

Malik Williams delivered two trick-play touchdowns on wide receiver passes, including one to quarterback Zac Thomas, and the defense made several important stops under tough circumstances to help Appalachian State maintain its perfect bowl record with a 45-13 victory against Middle Tennessee on Saturday night.

Appalachian led 24-6 at halftime even though Middle Tennessee (8-6) reached the App State 30 on four first-half drives, with Josh Thomas' red zone interception in the first quarter serving as a key momentum swing, and senior Okon Godwin accounted for 2.5 of the defense's six sacks. Anthony Flory, Demetrius Taylor and Chris Willis contributed in that category, and Tae Hayes also posted a first-half interception.

New Orleans Bowl MVP Zac Thomas threw three touchdown passes, including his ninth and 10th connections of the season with Corey Sutton. With Thomas Hennigan catching Williams' first touchdown and Henry Pearson also scoring on a Thomas throw, the Mountaineers totaled five TDs through the air.

Darrynton Evans rushed for 108 yards to go over 100 for the seventh time in the last nine games, and true freshman Camerun Peoples' 63-yard score on his second carry of the night gave the Mountaineers a 38-6 lead midway through the third quarter.

App State's first two touchdowns came on passes from Williams, but two turnovers in the first five offensive plays created an uphill battle for the Mountaineers.

Middle Tennessee, which had missed a 47-yard field goal to cap the game-opening series, followed a quick interception on App State's first series with a 24-yard field goal. The Blue Raiders faced a second down from the Appalachian 5 before Godwin and Noel Cook combined on a tackle for loss, and Desmond Franklin broke up a third-down pass to the end zone.

A fumble on the second play of App State's next series gave Middle Tennessee possession at the Mountaineers' 21, but Cook's pressure contributed to an interception by Josh Thomas at the 15 as left-handed quarterback Brent Stockstill rolled to his right.

Zac Thomas' 35-yard completion to Jalen Virgil was the big play on a drive that ended with a 22-yard field goal from Chandler Staton, whose kick followed a long snap from fill-in true freshman Max Durschlag.

Tyler Bird, D'Marco Jackson, Caleb Spurlin and Hennigan helped stuff a fourth-and-2 rush on a fake punt from the Middle Tennessee 43 a few minutes later, and Hennigan gave the Mountaineers the lead for good with a 30-yard touchdown on an accurate deep throw from Williams, the former high school quarterback who had caught a backward pass from Thomas near the right sideline.

The only other touchdown with an App State quarterback reaching the end zone on a pass play in recent memory occurred in 2010, when DeAndre Presley was credited with a TD "reception" on a play in which he recovered his receiver's fumble against Chattanooga and ran the final 33 yards with the ball.

Evans' 62-yard run set up Pearson's 1-yard touchdown reception in the final minute of the half, and Middle Tennessee advanced to the Appalachian 16 before settling for a 33-yard field goal as time expired in the second quarter.

Middle Tennessee posted a third-quarter touchdown to cut into its deficit, but App State's defense applied constant pressure to Stockstill the rest of the way, and Sutton capped the scoring on an 11-yard touchdown with 13:06 remaining.

Appalachian State University rallied from an early two-touchdown deficit to take a 31-17 victory over the University of Alabama at Birmingham in the 19th annual R+L Carriers New Orleans Bowl.

Trey Cobb's 24-yard fumble return for a touchdown snapped a 17-all tie and keyed a 21-point third quarter for the Mountaineers (13-1), who ended the regular season ranked No. 20 in the College Football Playoff rankings and both major polls and was the first nationally ranked team ever to play in the New Orleans Bowl.

App State running back Darrynton Evans, voted the game's Most Valuable Player, set a New Orleans Bowl record for yards per carry (8.3), finishing with 157 yards on 19 attempts and a touchdown.

Evans' touchdown came on an unusual fourth-and-1 play on the opening series of the third quarter. With App State trailing 14-10, quarterback Zac Thomas tried to convert on a quarterback sneak, but the ball was knocked loose. Evans picked it up in the backfield and ran 31 yards for a touchdown, giving the Mountaineers their first lead of the night.

UAB tied the game at 17-all on a 49-yard field goal by Nick Vogel.

On the Blazers' next possession, Nick Hampton sacked quarterback Tyler Johnston, forcing a fumble that Cobb scooped up and ran down the west sideline for the go-ahead score.

App State made it a two-score game in the final minute of the third quarter when Thomas and Hennigan connected for their second touchdown, this time from 27 yards.

The Blazers (9-5) jumped to a 14-0 lead in the first five minutes behind its passing game. Tyler Johnston connected on 25-yard touchdown passes to Hayden Pittman and Austin Watkins.

"Our defense gave up two plays early," said App State Coach Shawn Clark, who was coaching in his first game after replacing Eliah Drinkwitz last week. "After that, they played lights out."

The Sun Belt Conference champions finally got on the board early in the second quarter on a 34-yard field goal by Chandler Staton, then closed within 14-10 on 17-yard pass from Zac Thomas to Thomas Hennigan.

Despite the loss, the Blazers walked away optimistic about what is to come.

"We've got almost this whole team back," said UAB Coach Bill Clark, whose team won Conference USA's West Division title.

Georgia Southern (8-5) set a New Orleans Bowl record for margin of victory and tied the record for fewest points allowed, thanks to an opportunistic defense that turned away Tech five times inside the 30-yard line, including three straight interceptions in the first half.

Eagle quarterback Shai Werts, named the bowl's most valuable player, tied a bowl record with three touchdown runs and passed for a fourth score as Georgia Southern rolled up 448 yards of offense, including a bowl-record 322 on the ground.

Werts had a 1-yard touchdown run to cap the game's first possession, a 37-yard jaunt in the second quarter and another 1-yard scoring run in the third quarter. He finished with 71 yards on 15 carries and was 7-of-12 passing for 126 yards and a 65-yard touchdown pass to Khaleb Hood.

The other Eagle touchdown came on a 4-yard fourth-quarter run by Gerald Green, who finished with 108 yards rushing.

Jacob Barnes' 45-yard field goal just before halftime accounted for the only points for Louisiana Tech (5-5). Israel Tucker's 123 rushing yards accounted for more than half of the Bulldogs' 232 yards of total offense.

Georgia Southern's win was the fourth straight by the Sun Belt Conference over Conference USA in the New Orleans Bowl.

Louisiana scored 20 fourth-quarter points, including rushing touchdowns by Montrell Johnson and Emani Bailey inside the final four minutes, as the 23rd-ranked Ragin' Cajuns rallied to defeat Marshall, 36-21, in the 2021 R+L Carriers New Orleans Bowl.

Quarterback Levi Lewis was named the game's Most Valuable Player after completing 19-of-31 passes for 270 yards and a touchdown while rushing 12 times for another 74 yards.

The contest marked just the third time in New Orleans Bowl history that a team rallied from behind in the fourth quarter and Louisiana's point total in the final 15 minutes was the most since the bowl's inception in 2001.

Trailing 21-16 following a nine-yard scoring jaunt by Marshall running back Rahseen Ali with 1:01 to play in the third quarter, the Cajuns (13-1) started the comeback with 11:54 to play and drove 68 yards on eight plays - which Bailey capped with a 4-yard touchdown - to take a one-point lead. Louisiana failed to convert the two-point try, but was far from finished as the Ragin' Cajuns followed with drives of 73 yards on six plays and a 52-yard drive on six plays to account for the final score.

Not to be outdone, the UL defense rose to the occasion in the fourth quarter as the Sun Belt Conference champions held the Thundering Herd to 5 yards of total offense during the final 15 minutes.

The Cajuns finished the day with 220 yards rushing, with Bailey leading the way with 94 yards and a pair of scores on 17 attempts. Dontae Fleming paced the UL receiving corps with four grabs while Michael Jefferson tallied a game-high 108 yards receiving, setting a New Orleans Bowl record with an average of 36 yards per reception.

Louisiana got things going early on, taking the opening kickoff and driving 81 yards on 13 plays with Lewis finding Kyren Lacy for a 9-yard scoring strike to grab the early lead. Following a three-and-out by the Marshall offense, the Ragin' Cajuns extended their lead on a 42-yard field goal by Nate Snyder to go on top, 10-0, with 1:29 to play in the first quarter.

Three plays later, however, Marshall (7-6) got on the board on a 63-yard touchdown run by Ali and the Herd back added a 14-yard scoring run to take a 14-10 lead with 10:32 to play in the second quarter.

The Ragin' Cajuns cut the deficit to one on a 25-yard boot by Snyder and closed out the half with another Snyder kick - this time from 24 yards out - to take a 16-14 lead into halftime.

Marshall reclaimed the upper hand midway through the third when Ali scored from 9 yards out to set up the Cajuns' fourth-quarter onslaught.

Ali's three scores tied a New Orleans Bowl record for rushing touchdowns as he finished the night with 160 yards, third-most in the game's history, on 20 carries. Wells went 15-for-26 for 99 yards, and Gammage led the Herd with nine catches for 50 yards.

Western Kentucky scored on the game's first two possessions and never looked back in a 44-23 victory over South Alabama in the 22nd annual R+L Carriers New Orleans Bowl.

The Hilltoppers rolled up 677 yards of total offense, including a New Orleans Bowl record 522 passing yards. Quarterback Austin Reed, the game's Most Valuable Player, set four New Orleans Bowl records in completing 36 of 55 passes for 497 yards and four touchdowns.

WKU became the first team in New Orleans Bowl history and only the third FBS team in the last 25 years of bowl games to have three receivers gain 100 or more yards. Dalvin Smith had six catches for a career-high 145 yards and a touchdown, Jaylen Hall caught nine passes for 138 yards and a TD, and Malachi Corley had a team-best 11 receptions for 114 yards and two scores.

Western Kentucky gained 434 first-half yards in building a 31-3 halftime lead. Reed's 44-yard touchdown pass to Smith and a 27-yard scoring toss to Joey Beljan staked the Tops to a quick 14-0 lead with 8:46 left in the first quarter.

Smith later showed off his arm with a 27-yard touchdown pass to Hall early in the second quarter.

The teams exchanged field goals before WKU drove 75 yards in the final 98 seconds of the half, scoring on an untimed down to end the half as Reed tossed a 1-yard shovel pass to Corley.

South Alabama quarterback Connor Bradley passed for three second-half touchdowns to try to keep pace. Bradley completed 36 of 53 passes for 360 yards.

WKU's Corley and South Alabama's Devin Voisin became the third and fourth receivers in New Orleans Bowl history to catch 11 passes in a single game.

Each team completed 37 passes on the night, and the 74 total completions tied an NCAA bowl record originally set in 2017 by Wake Forest and Texas A&M in the Belk Bowl in Charlotte.

The victory by the Hilltoppers was the first for Conference USA in the New Orleans Bowl since 2016 and snapped a five-game winning streak for Sun Belt Conference schools in the game.

For the first time since the 2011 matchup between Louisiana and San Diego State, both schools were making their New Orleans Bowl debuts.

In a contest that featured the second-most plays in college bowl game history and spanned three hours and 47 minutes, it was worth every snap and every second for Jacksonville State as the Gamecocks posed a 34-31 overtime victory over Louisiana in the 23rd annual R+L Carriers New Orleans Bowl Saturday afternoon.

With the score knotted at 31-all, and after watching his defense hold the Cajuns scoreless in the opening possession of the extra period, Jax State running back Ron Wiggins carried six consecutive times to get his team down to the Ragin' Cajuns' 9-yard line. From there, Garrison Ripa nailed a 27-yard field goal to spark the Gamecocks' celebration.

Playing in its first bowl game since making the leap to NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision status a year ago, Jacksonville State (9-4) piled up 526 yards of total offense on 109 total plays and outgained Louisiana on the ground, 290-92.

Wiggins was named the game's Most Valuable Player after gaining 126 yards and a touchdown on 27 carries on the ground while pulling down three passes for another 16 yards through the air.

The Ragin' Cajuns (6-7) used three defensive scores – including a 46-yard fumble return and a 16-yard interception return for touchdown by safety Jalen Clark – to keep things interesting.

Clark's first score came on the opening drive of the ballgame, and teammate Keyon Martin intercepted a pass on the next possession. Jacksonville State, however, responded with a 10-play, 80-yard drive that Cole Fuller capped with a one-yard plunge from the upback position to time things at 7-all.

Clark's pick-six made it 14-7 with 4:22 to play in the first half, but the Gamecocks once again had an answer as they marked 75 yards on 14 plays with Wiggins going to final seven less than four minutes later to make it 14-14 at the break.

Both offenses picked things up in the second half as Ripa booted a 22-yard field goal at the 7:55 mark of the third quarter, UL quarterback Chandler Fields scored a one-yard rushing touchdown, and JSU added a 10-yard scoring run by reserve signal caller Logan Smothers in the third quarter. Following a 33-yard field goal by Kenneth Almendares just 58 seconds into the fourth, the Ragin' Cajuns appeared to take control of the contest on 43-yard interception return for touchdown by Tyree Skipper to stake the squad to a 31-24 advantage with just 5:32 to play in regulation.

But as they had done all day, the Gamecocks answered with an eight-play, 70-yard drive that saw Zion Webb hit Perry Carter with a 18-yard touchdown pass on fourth down to tie things up with 1:46 to go and set up the overtime period.

Louisiana got as far as the Jax State 44 before a sack pushed them out of potential long field goal range at the end of regulation.

The Cajuns also had the ball first in OT, but failed to gain one yard and Almendares' 43-yard field goal attempt sailed wide left. Moments later, the Gamecocks closed out the second overtime game in New Orleans Bowl history.
